8. How will you prepare your class for this field study? Describe any preparation you will do with your class before undertaking this field study.
9. List the key outdoor field study activities your student will be doing that support the criteria of this grant.
 - Describe how or what the students will be doing to support experiential/ hands-on activities (e.g. classifying, checking, comparing, conducting, executing, implementing, identifying, interpreting, producing, etc.).
 - Include your overall field study/day overview and timeframe (e.g. itinerary or agenda) or upload.
